Going toward a World Security Authority?

Regulating authorities create an international network

At the invitation of CNAPS, the new French Private Security Authority, delegations of authorities regulating private security in Germany, Belgium, Canada, Spain, Ireland, Malta, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom and Switzerland, met on October 28th 2013, in Paris. Considering the importance of ongoing developments in all areas of private security (perimeter, training, control, authorization scheme, etc...), the participants have decided to establish a committee in order to create an international network of private security regulators.

An internet platform for exchanges on laws, regulations and best practices will be implemented. Dialogue with North American regulatory authorities will be launched. CNAPS will coordinate the network until the next meeting in October 2014.

CNAPS had previously made contacts with the UK SIA and with ABI officers.

Regarding the new regulations, the licensing process is coming to an end in France. The latest CNAPS report showed that there is total of just under 6,500 security companies holding the new licence, among which only 750 are private investigators.
